We, as Girl Scouts of the 21st century, are forever grateful for the strong women that began such a monumental movement that paved the pathway to prepare girls across the nation for a lifetime of leadership and success for many years to come. As we recognize and appreciate the courage and resilience of those involved in our movement in the past, we look forward to seeing Girl Scouts, present and future, continue to share the gift of Girl Scouting with the world.

Looking ahead, we strive to be an organization that enthusiastically embraces Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Diversity recognizes the wide array of differences among people of the world. All are welcome. Equity pertains to the rights of all to have fair access to resources and outcomes. We are committed to informed policies and practices, intentionally designed to promote opportunity for all. What started as a passion project of Juliette Gordon Low has evolved into a preeminent leadership organization for girls that focuses on 4 pillars – STEM, Life Skills, Outdoors, and Entrepreneurship. Each year we are continually amazed by Girl Scouts from our council embracing the four pillars and translating what they learn into their own lives. In September, when Hurricane Ian came ashore devastating the coast of southwest Florida, the Girl Scouts of Gulfcoast Florida were among the first to react. While many were dealing with damages within their own lives and homes, we saw remarkable demonstrations of community service and impressive presentations of grace and kindness by our girls.

To name just a few, Troop 900 collected over 2,000 feminine hygiene products to distribute to girls in need after Hurricane Ian caused many stores to close. Troop 617 collected toys, puzzles, books and more for a Vineland Elementary Pre-K class to replace classroom items destroyed by the storm. Troop 254 collected, packaged, and distributed hurricane supplies to those in need all over Sarasota County. During a natural disaster like Hurricane Ian, Girl Scouts prove the importance of lending a hand and being a part of an organization that encourages you to do so.

During 2022, we congratulated 20 Gold Award Girl Scouts, the largest group to date. These are girls whose Girl Scouting career was abruptly interrupted by a global pandemic, but despite all obstacles still managed to complete their Gold Award projects.

Being a Girl Scout means having the confidence to be yourself, unapologetically. It's what inspires you to challenge the status quo, and work hard for issues or ideas you are passionate about. It is the courage to lean on your sister Girl Scouts when you've been knocked down, and trusting the skills you've learned throughout your journey to pick yourself back up. It is people like you that continue the Girl Scout Legacy that Juliette Gordon Low established so long ago.
